O. C. JONES & SONS WINS NATIONAL AWARD FOR QUALITY IN ASPHALT PAVING

Lanham, MD - The National Asphalt Pavement Association (NAPA) announced today that O. C. Jones & Sons of Berkeley, Calif., has won a 2011 Quality in Construction Award for excellence in construction of an asphalt pavement. The company received its award at a special ceremony during the association's 57th Annual Meeting in Palm Desert, Calif.

The Quality in Construction Award recognizes asphalt pavements of excellence. "NAPA selects the recipients of its paving awards using a known set of standards that have been shown to give a good result," commented Kim Snyder, 2011 Chairman of the NAPA Board of Directors. "This award demonstrates the high quality of work that O. C. Jones & Sons is achieving."

O. C. Jones & Sons won the award for the mill and overlay of six miles northbound and southbound of Route 101 in Marin County. The company won the job with a bid significantly less than the engineer's estimate and in 52 days instead of the maximum 310 days allowed for the job. Despite challenges that included weather delays and environmental restrictions, O. C. Jones & Sons produced a smooth, high-quality asphalt pavement on time and within budget.

The National Asphalt Pavement Association (U.S.) is the only trade association that exclusively represents the interests of the asphalt pavement material producer/ contractor on the national level with Congress, government agencies, and other national trade and business organizations.
